

Highlight Speech 1: The Impact of Geopolitical Unity Among Muslim Nations in Global Trade Union

The Future Research Grand Launching Ceremony witnessed an insightful first highlight speech by Prof. Dr. Hussain Mohi-Ud-Din Qadri as its Senior Advisory Fellow (Business and Economics), who emphasized the importance of ummah unity in fostering social welfare, justice, and economic collaboration among Muslim nations.

During his address, Prof. Dr. Hussain highlighted that the golden era of the Islamic civilization during the

Umayyad and Abbasid Caliphates should serve as an exemplary model for contemporary economic and trade strategies. He stressed that the progress and advancements made during those eras were driven by a strong sense of unity, knowledge exchange, and strategic economic planning.

A key concern raised in his speech was that Malaysia's major export and import partners do not include any Muslim majority countries. This, he pointed out, signifies a missed opportunity for economic collaboration within the Islamic world. Prof. Dr. Hussain urged Muslim countries to strengthen trade and economic ties, leveraging their comparative advantages by focusing on sectors where they can produce goods and services efficiently.

He outlined that economic integration among Muslim nations could be facilitated by harmonizing trade policies, including the reduction of tariffs and the development of infrastructure that enables seamless economic activities. He further emphasized that such integration would enhance collective bargaining power on the global stage, making it crucial for Muslim nations to establish regional trade agreements that help standardize and reduce trade barriers among them.

Prof. Dr. Hussain also underscored the importance of recognizing and leveraging each other's economic strengths to build strong trade and economic partnerships. Aligning regulatory frameworks, standardizing quality measures, and investing in key infrastructures were among the strategies he proposed to create a cohesive and efficient economic network among Muslim countries.

Lastly, he stressed that Muslim nations should prioritize the development and promotion of Shariah-compliant products and services, ensuring consumer confidence, loyalty, and trust in the global Islamic market. This, he noted, would not only cater to the growing demand for ethical and Shariah compliant goods but also create a sustainable economic ecosystem for the ummah.





The speech delivered by Prof. Dr. Hussain resonated strongly with attendees, reinforcing the need for greater collaboration, policy harmonization, and strategic economic planning to uplift the economic position of Muslim countries on the global stage.

Highlight Speech 2: Firm Foundations of Growth; Finding from the World Bank East Asia & Pacific Economic Update

In a compelling highlight speech at The Future Research's Grand Launching Ceremony, Dr. Aakash Mohpal from the World Bank Group shed light on the economic growth trends, challenges, and policy considerations for Malaysia and the broader East Asia & Pacific region.

Dr. Aakash highlighted that economic growth in East Asia, including Malaysia, outpaced other regions from 2019 to 2024. However, he cautioned that this growth remains below pre-pandemic levels, emphasizing that

recovery should not be taken for granted due to mounting external and domestic challenges.

Among the external factors affecting economic growth in the region, he pointed to recovering global trade are trade-distorting policies, and still-tight financial conditions. He alos noted that protectionist policies have increased, with nearly two-thirds of World Trade Organization (WTO) countries implementing industrial policies such as subsidies targeting specific industries. Additionally, inflationary pressures and increasing interest rates continue to weigh on financial conditions, making borrowing more expensive for businesses and governments alike as much as risking capital flights.

On the domestic front, Dr. Aakash Mohpal raised concerns over rising corporate and household debt, which have surpassed pre-pandemic levels. He also noted that policy uncertainty remains high, causing businesses to adopt a "wait-and-see" approach that delays crucial investment decisions. This hesitation, coupled with elevated interest rates, high corporate debt, and sluggish exports, has resulted in lower private investment across the region, including Malaysia.

Furthermore, governments have been unable to provide a significant boost in public investment due to limited fiscal capacity, restricting their ability to drive economic momentum. While exports are gradually recovering, they still have not reached prepandemic levels, further compounding economic pressures.

In his concluding remarks, Dr. Mohpal emphasized that for Malaysia and its regional peers to boost productivity and sustain long-term growth, they must focus on enhancing competition, strengthening skills development, investing in adequate infrastructure, and expanding digital industries. These efforts, he stressed, are crucial in ensuring resilience against global economic headwinds and fostering sustainable growth in the years ahead.





His speech served as a crucial reminder of the delicate balance between policy reforms, external market conditions, and domestic economic strategies required to navigate an increasingly complex global economic landscape.

Title: Resiliently Withstanding Geopolitical & Economic Uncertainties

Let me start my sharing session today with a conversation that I had with one young girl few months ago: I asked her a simple question - what do you want to be when you grow up? Her answer surprised me: "I want to marry someone rich, and be a housewife". What does it mean here: that life is hard and so uncertain in many ways, demanding journey in the future, and that girl's strategy to resiliently facing the uncertainties of course in a unique way.

I am truly honored to stand before you today, in this gathering of regional and global leaders from research

houses and think tanks. I am glad to see some familiar faces, which in short signifies our collective commitment to understanding and addressing the pressing challenges of our time.

I extend my heartfelt gratitude to The Future Research for their dedication to insightful research and policy analysis, which will undoubtedly contribute to our shared goal of a resilient

and prosperous future.

By no means that my notes today would constitute a lecture or in-depth analysis of such heavy topics that could become a full-fledged research paper, but rather some of my personal observations: which might be true or just a bluff.

I am truly honored to stand before you today, in this gathering of regional and global leaders from research houses and think tanks.

An honest disclaimer here, that I would consider myself here as a NOBODY, because of what I would say today would not create any effect whatsoever until the day comes to me as a person who holds that responsibility.

The term geopolitics denotes a broad analytical framework in international relations, encompassing different phenomena such as political instability, tensions and military conflicts between countries, terrorist threats, or geographical events that can have regional or global impacts.

Geopolitical uncertainties can arise from various global and regional issues, including:

#### **Geopolitical Conflicts:**

- **U.S.-China Relations:** Trade tensions, technological rivalry, and military competition in the South China Sea.
- Russia-Ukraine Conflict: Ongoing war with significant global, economic, and security implications.
- Middle East Instability: Mostly contributed by the Zionist and other foreign players.
- North Korea: Nuclear ambitions and unpredictability of its leadership.





#### **Environmental and Resource Security:**

- Climate Change: Impact on resources, migration, and international agreements.
- Energy Security: Dependence on oil and gas, especially from volatile regions.

#### **Security and Risk Management:**

- Global Terrorism: Activities of groups like ISIS and al-Qaeda.
- Cybersecurity Threats: State-sponsored cyberattacks and espionage.

#### **Health and Pandemics:**

(i) Pandemics: Health crises that can disrupt global stability and economies, resulting in widespread unemployment and decreased consumer spending, putting pressure on public finances and social systems.

These uncertainties can have wide-reaching effects on international relations, economies, and security dynamics.

Economic uncertainties can stem from various factors, including:

#### **Economic Factors:**

- Global Recession Risks: Potential downturns in major economies affecting global trade and investment.
- **Inflation:** Rising prices impacting consumer purchasing power and economic stability.
- Monetary Policy: Uncertainty around interest rate changes by central banks.
- Debt Levels: High public and private debt burdens leading to financial instability.
- Consumer Confidence: Fluctuations in consumer spending based on economic outlook.

#### Health crises that disrupt global stability and economies, resulting in widespread unemployment decreased consumer spending, putting pressure on public finances and social systems. These uncertainties wide-reaching can have effects international on relations, economies, security dynamics.

#### **Trade and Supply Chain:**

- Supply Chain Disruptions: Interruptions due to geopolitical tensions, natural disasters, or pandemics.
- **Trade Wars:** Tariffs and trade barriers impacting global commerce.
- Currency Fluctuations: Exchange rate volatility affecting trade and investment.

#### **Market and Financial Factors:**

- Energy Prices: Volatility in oil, gas, and renewable energy markets.
- Financial Market Volatility: Stock market fluctuations affecting wealth and investment decisions.
- Corporate Performance: Variability in business profits and investment levels.

#### **Technological and Labor Market Factors:**

- **Technological Change:** Rapid advancements leading to job displacement and industry upheavals.
- Labor Market Dynamics: Unemployment rates, wage growth, and labor force participation.





#### **Political and Environmental Factors:**

- **Political Instability:** Domestic and international political events impacting economic policies and investor confidence.
- Climate Change: Economic costs of adapting to and mitigating its impacts.

These uncertainties can significantly influence economic planning and decision-making for businesses, governments, and individuals.

So, if we are to elaborate on the geopolitical and economic uncertainties facing us, would there be any easy fix to the problems?

The answer, and at least my answer, is that there would be NO quick remedy or single fix to the issues. Ideally, if we are able to solve each of those uncertainties - then problem solved. But life is not ideal; most things are not within our control: say pandemics, US-China trade war, Russia-Ukraine conflicts, natural disasters, and even pump and dump schemes (or rather fraudsters) in the stock market.

The problem is, even though we are living interconnected with each other in various parts of the world, no two countries have the same semblance, even any two neighboring countries; be it geographical challenges (Scandinavian or North America, Middle East, Far East), demographical, education background, culture, democracy, power and laws, and the list goes on.

We need to give priority to which problem comes first to solve. Which needs to be done urgently, which are important to deal with, which has the biggest impact, which are low-hanging fruits, and which require more intricate discussions and planning.

Even among economists, for example, their opinion varies, and often clouded by their upbringing and belief system. Take such a case when Peter Navarro, an American economist who served in the Trump administration as director of the White House National Trade Council (and other various positions in the Trump Administration), also was a professor emeritus of economics and public policy at the University of California, and a Harvard graduate. Navarro's views on trade are significantly outside the mainstream of economic thought and are widely considered weird by other economists.

Take the moment in 2018, as the Trump administration was implementing trade-protectionist policies with the belief that no country would retaliate against U.S. tariffs for the simple reason that "we are the most lucrative and biggest market in the world."

Shortly after the implementation of the tariffs, other countries did implement retaliatory tariffs against the United States, leading to trade wars.

My point is this: if we want to mitigate all these uncertainties, we need to look at each and every country individually, to see what they have, what is their economic state, what are their demographics, and so on, as one solution may work in one country but wouldn't work in another.

We need to give priority to which problem comes first to solve. Which needs to be done urgently, which are important to deal with, which has the biggest impact, which are low-hanging fruits, and which require more intricate discussions and planning.





It's not enough to just have a standard economic council in order to address these uncertainties. Country leaders need to get people from all backgrounds involved; some kind of non-political initiatives, where politicians from both the government and the opposition sit together at the table, along with other stakeholders such as traders, economists, industry players, civil society and non-governmental organizations, legal advisors, tech experts, and so on.

They all need to sit together, putting their differences aside, and discuss relentlessly, to come up with the right solution that fits their particular country.

#### **Examples of Resilience Strategies in Terengganu**

- 1. For the State of Terengganu, we have made some notable progress in diversifying our economy, which is to enhance our sturdiness or resilience.
- 2. Historically, we are so dependent on the oil and gas industry, now the state has turned towards renewable and hydrogen energy, greenhouse initiatives, biopolymer-pharmaceutical industries, smart farming and agriculture sectors, sustainable fisheries, tourism, and etc.
- 3.As a result, based on the Auditor General's Report, on average, between the years 2018 to 2021, our dependency on petroleum royalty has actually lessened to 68.7% compared to 72.7% for the years 2014 to 2017. That is a 4% drop. This is only the beginning.

#### Notable Examples from ASEAN Countries; Singapore

- Singapore is recognized as a prime example of economic resilience and innovation within ASEAN. The nation has effectively diversified its economy by fostering growth in sectors such as finance, biotechnology, and information technology.
- Additionally, significant investments in technological advancements, including smart city projects and digital infrastructure, have bolstered Singapore's economic competitiveness and resilience (Smart Nation Singapore, 2024).

#### Vietnam

- Vietnam has showcased impressive resilience and rapid economic expansion, establishing
  itself as a key player in the ASEAN region. Through aggressive economic reforms and
  liberalization, Vietnam has attracted significant foreign direct investment (FDI) (World Bank,
  2024).
- The country's emphasis on manufacturing and export-driven growth has turned it into a major global manufacturing hub, particularly in electronics and textiles. By diversifying its export markets and strengthening trade relationships, Vietnam has further enhanced its economic stability (Vietnam Ministry of Planning and Investment, 2024).
- Moreover, investments in infrastructure development have improved transportation and logistics, supporting the country's economic growth and resilience.





#### Suggestion

- 1. Now we come to the final part of my session which would be some of the possible options to be considered, and I have to say that it is "a geographical and time-sensitive" option:
- 2.Integrated Halal Supply Chain Network: The establishment of a blockchain-based halal supply chain network addresses critical issues of transparency and traceability within the halal industry. By connecting halal producers, suppliers, and retailers on a unified platform, this network ensures that halal standards are consistently met throughout the supply chain. This approach supports the growth of the halal industry by providing a reliable and transparent system that upholds stringent halal requirements.
- 3. Blockchain-Based Supply Chain Resilience: Developing a national blockchain platform for critical goods, such as food and medicine, can improve visibility and efficiency, thus reducing disruptions and bottlenecks. This solution addresses supply chain vulnerabilities and ensures a more stable and responsive system during crises, thereby enhancing overall supply chain resilience and effectiveness.
- 4. Sustainable Waqf Investment Funds: Utilizing Waqf endowments for sustainable investment projects offers a dual benefit of generating social and financial returns while promoting sustainable development. By pooling Waqf funds into investment vehicles focused on specific programs, this approach would align charitable giving with impactful development projects.
- 5. Public-Private Innovation Hubs: Establishing public-private innovation hubs can drive economic diversification and resilience by fostering collaboration among government agencies, private companies, and academic institutions. These hubs, focusing on emerging technologies such as renewable energy, biotechnology, and artificial intelligence, provide resources and support to startups and SMEs.
- 6.Resilient Workforce Programs: Implementing continuous education and re-skilling programs can significantly enhance workforce adaptability and economic resilience. Developing a national online platform that provides free courses in high-demand fields supports skill development and aligns educational outcomes with market needs. Partnerships with employers can offer practical experience and job placements, ensuring that training translates into real employment opportunities.

In navigating geopolitical and economic uncertainties, the resilience of a nation is paramount. We need to settle on a multiple-angle approach to building resilience.

Take the examples of ASEAN countries like Singapore and Vietnam to illustrate how





diversification and innovation can bolster economic stability. Muslim countries such as Turkey and the UAE further highlight the importance of strategic investments and economic reforms in maintaining resilience amid global challenges.

We will emerge stronger, more united, and more prosperous. Together, with the collaboration of regional and global leaders, research houses, think tanks, and our international partners, we will build a resilient Malaysia that stands tall on the global stage.

However, to summarize every single one of my points: "The remedy to the uncertainties is there all along, choose your pick and move on."

### Keynote Address by YB Tan Sri Dato' Seri Abdul Hadi Awang: Learning from Islamic Civilization

YB Tan Sri Dato' Seri Abdul Hadi Awang drew historical parallels to the golden era of Islam Caliphate, explaining how economic hubs flourished through strategic investments and infrastructure, such as free hotels for travellers that attracting traders and fostering commerce. He also emphasized:

- The historic economic wisdom of Sayyidina Uthman, who bought a
  well from a Jewish for public use, highlighting early forms of how
  Islaimc economics system provide social welfare for everyone.
- Syariah compliant diplomatic mission, where Muslim nations can engage in diplomatic ties with non Muslim countries transparently and with integrity.
- The importance of integrated currency among Muslim countries.
- The geopolitical advantage of SG4 states being strategically located between major trade hubs—Japan, China (East), and India (West).
- SG4 must focus on solving immediate issues, such as cost of living and land ownership, before moving to long-term strategies.









### Keynote Address by Tun Dr. Mahathir Mohamad: Strategic Governance for SG4

Tun Mahathir stressed the need to understand government operations to meet SG4's goals, particularly:

- How government financing can support contractors and infrastructure projects.
- The importance of clear FDI terms to ensure compliance and prevent unfavorable agreements.
- The necessity of a clean, transparent, and skilled workforce to manage FDI.
- The critical role of knowledgeable and efficient federal and state leadership in administration and economic execution.

#### Chief Ministers' Insights on State Economic Plans

#### Perlis MB:

- Dolomite mining expected to generate RM3.48 million per year.
- Tourism and water park projects in the pipeline for Perlis state government planning.

#### • Kelantan MB:

- Kelantan's growth is anchored on Islamic leadership, economic development, and holistic education.
- Tahfiz schools incorporate Quran, Science, and Skills-based education
- Key economic resources focused are on oil, gold, iron ore, granite, rare earth elements (REE), halal industry, and agriculture.

#### Kedah MB:

- Kedah has received RM142 billion in FDI over the past three years, RM30.9 billion in Q1 2024 alone.
- InvestKedah's roles in managing industries and the Kulim High-Tech Park are remarkable.
- Malaysia's largest padi producer (142,000 hectares), but conditional land regulations limit revenue collection. If resolved, Kedah could recover RM200 million in lost revenue.
- Kedah Aerotropolis (KXP) project pending an aerodrome license from the Federal Government, crucial for investor' confidence to inject capital on the mega project.

#### Terengganu MB:

- SG4 is not about competition but strategic cooperation, similar to APAC, BRICS, TPPA, D8, G7, OIC, EU and so on.
- 70% of Malaysia's REE reserves are in SG4 states. Since REE is underground, territorial disputes over nautical miles shouldn't impact royalties.
- 10 Key Agendas for SG4's Economic Growth:
  - 1. Railway integration via ECRL for better logistics.
- 2. Climate change risk management.
- 3. Collaboration across all four states for ecnomic planning.
- 4. Cross-state Exco collaboration for better decision-making.
- 5. Scaling up food production to an industrial level.
- 6. Prioritizing food security.





- 7. Long-term vision for education.
- 8. Developing a highly skilled workforce.
- 9. Efficient governance.
- 10. Sustainable state revenues through inter-state knowledge sharing.





Prof. Dr. Barjoyai highlighted the potential of:

- The potential of integration between Southern Thailand-Terengganu Corridor for better tourism and trade exchange.
- Waqf as a financial model, aligning with the Maliki school, which permits waqf for non-cash assets such as land and farms.
- Encouraging cash waqf investments to ensure sustainable capital flow.

# Our Research & Commentaries Political Landscape

### 1- Redelination In Malaysia; Effects On Sustainability of The Malay Muslim Political Power and Racial Integration

This study examines the redistricting process likely to be proposed by focusing on dividing the Federation and States into electoral divisions with approximately equal voter numbers. This is considered a step towards upholding human rights, ensuring equality, and eliminating electoral discrimination. The study also evaluates the implications of the proposed redistricting process on governance, representation, and equality.

#### 2- Study on the Implementation of Local Authority (PBT) Elections

This study investigates the Local Authority (PBT) system in Malaysia, encompassing City Councils, Municipal Councils, and District Councils. It compares Malaysia's system with countries that have local elections and those without local councilor positions, aiming to explore potential reforms for governance, representation, and accountability.

#### 3- A Study on the Perception and Acceptance of Non-Malay Voters in Selangor

A study was conducted to understand the perception and acceptance of non-Malay voters in Selangor, focusing on their political preferences, the issues they prioritize, and their support for various political parties. The research aimed to assess how different political ideologies and party coalitions are viewed by the non Malay communities in specific constituencies.

#### 4- Redelineation of Sabah and Sarawak

The claim for one-third of the parliamentary seats in Sabah and Sarawak has become a heated topic in Malaysian politics. This demand stems from the Malaysia Agreement 1963 (MA63), which saw the inclusion of Sabah and Sarawak into the Federation of Malaysia. However, this claim raises legal and political questions regarding the fairness and legitimacy of the distribution of parliamentary seats between Peninsular Malaysia and the Borneo states.

#### 5- Election in Kuala Kubu Bharu Study 1 & Study 2 (2024)

This report presents findings from two studies on the level of support for political parties in the Kuala Kubu Bharu (KBB) region, focusing on the support of various ethnic groups (Malay, Chinese, and Indian) for PH, PN, BN, and the "Tidak Kisah" (Undecided) group. It provides insights into the trends and patterns of support in the upcoming election and offers strategic recommendations for contesting parties to improve its chances of winning.

#### 6- Election in Sungai Bakap (2024)

This report provides an analysis of the support from various racial groups, especially the Malay, Indian, and Chinese communities, towards the contesting coalitions in the context of the Sungai Bakap by-election. It explores factors influencing voter preferences, key issues, and strategic measures to increase support.





### Our Research & Commentaries Economic Development

#### 1- Reducing National Debt To GDP Ratio In Malaysia

This study examines the impact of fiscal policies on the national debt-to-GDP ratio in Malaysia, with comparisons to other Asian and ASEAN countries. It highlights the relationship between fiscal expansion, austerity measures, and debt sustainability, revealing key trends and implications for Malaysia's economic strategies during the period from 2020 to 2024.

#### 2- Fuel Subsidies And Their Impact On National Budgets And People Well Being In Malaysia

This study investigates the impacts of fuel subsidies in Malaysia, focusing on their financial, socio-economic, and environmental implications. While subsidies aim to stabilize energy costs and support low-income households, they pose challenges such as fiscal deficits, social inequities, and environmental degradation. Comparative insights from Indonesia, Thailand, and India highlight opportunities for reforming Malaysia's subsidy framework.

#### 1- Medical Specialists Parallel Pathways in Malaysia

Malaysia faces a critical shortage of medical specialists, a challenge that directly impacts the quality and accessibility of healthcare services. Currently, there are 13,000 specialists, far below the projected need of 30,000 by 2030 to meet rising healthcare demands. This report examines key challenges within the context of the Parallel Pathway program and offers strategic recommendations to address the specialist shortage effectively.

#### 2- Resetting Education In Malaysia: Dual Language Program

Malaysia's educational policies have undergone significant changes, particularly in the medium of instruction for Science and Mathematics. The shift from the Teaching and Learning of Science and Mathematics in English (PPSMI) to the Dual Language Program (DLP) and High-Impact Practices (HIP) under the MBMMBI policy reflects the country's efforts to balance the need for global competitiveness with the preservation of national identity. While PPSMI aimed at enhancing English proficiency, it encountered practical challenges, particularly in rural areas. This led to its replacement by DLP and HIP, which aimed to offer a more flexible and inclusive approach to language of instruction.

#### 3- Resetting Education In Malaysia: Vernacular System

The issue of vernacular education in Malaysia has significant implications for national unity in a multicultural society. Rooted in Malaysia's colonial history, vernacular schools





were established to preserve the linguistic and cultural heritage of different ethnic groups. Despite efforts to integrate these schools into the national education system, challenges persist, particularly regarding language barriers, with students in vernacular schools often struggling with Bahasa Melayu proficiency. This has complicated their integration into the national education system. This report discusses the ongoing challenges and proposes recommendations for improving education system to foster national unity in multiracial society.

### 1- Analysis Of Research Findings "Addressing Misunderstandings Among Muslim and Non-Muslim Professionals Towards PAS"

This study explores the perceptions of Muslim and non-Muslim professionals in Malaysia regarding the Pan-Malaysian Islamic Party (PAS). PAS, a prominent political party in Malaysia, has been a central figure in the country's political discourse, especially concerning its stance on Islam and its policies related to Sharia law and the rights of non-Muslims. The study delves into key issues such as PAS's agenda for an Islamic state, the implications of Sharia law, and its relationship with non-Muslim communities and other political entities. Additionally, the study examines how PAS's governance and leadership influence its policies in states under its administration, as well as its broader impact on Malaysian society and politics. The primary focus is to understand the perceptions of professionals from diverse fields about these issues and the role that PAS plays in shaping Malaysia's political and social landscape.

### 2- The Rise and Fall of the Governments Led by Islamic Political Parties Worldwide: Challenges & Lessons.

This study examines the rise and fall of eight Islamic political movements or parties that have governed, either independently or in coalition with others: Masyumi (Indonesia), Taliban (Afghanistan), Ennahda (Tunisia), Freedom and Justice Party (Egypt), Jamaat al-Islami (Pakistan), Hamas (Palestine), Iraqi Islamic Party (Iraq), and the Justice and Development Party (AKP) in Turkey. It analyzes the factors behind their success, such as popular support and political strategies, and the challenges they faced, including instability, internal conflict, and balancing Islamic values with modern governance. For those that have fallen, the study identifies causes like military coups, loss of support, and failure to meet citizens' needs. For those still in power, it explores ongoing challenges and offers lessons for improving governance and stability.




